THE VENUE: PESHAWAR - THE CITY OF FLOWERS & HOSPITALITY

The history of Peshawar, the capital of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, goes back as far as at least 539 BC, making it the oldest living city in Pakistan and one of the oldest in South and Central Asia.

Khyber Pass It is a mountain pass connecting Afghanistan and Pakistan. An integral part of the ancient Silk Road, it is one of the oldest known passes in the world. Throughout history it has been an important trade route between Central Asia and South Asia and a strategic military location. The summit of the pass is 5 kilometres (3.1 mi) inside Pakistan at Landi Kotal.



Qissa Khawani Bazaar Extending from west to east in the heart of the city is the romantic 'Street of Story-tellers' - the Qissa Khawani Bazzar. In the ancient times, there used to be professional story tellers. The caravan arriving from different central Asian states used to stay and enjoy cup of green tea while listening to the stories of the story tellers.



Bala Hisar Fort

Built on a raised platform from the ground level, the Bala Hisar (The high) Fort stands at the north-western edge of the city, the original structure was raised in 1519 AD during the reign of the Mughal Emperor Babar. It is a

heavily-guarded fort that is located centrally now and provides a majestic view over Peshawar and surrounding valley.

Ghanta Ghar (Clock Tower) For-tiered clock tower erected at the turn of the century on the eve of Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee is another gem in the history of Peshawar that catches the eye. Just besides the clock tower is the food street of Peshawar city, known for local and traditional food.

Peshawar Museum The Peshawar Museum was built in 1907. The two-story building features an amalgamation of British, South Asian, Hindu, Buddhist and Mughal Islamic architectural styles. The current collection has almost 14,000 items based on Gandhara, Greco-Buddhist, Kushan, Parthian, and Indo-Scythian life.

Mahabat Khan Mosque The Mosque Mahabat is an outstanding architecture legacy, in Jeweller's Bazar. Built by Mahabat Khan, the governor of Peshawar, in 1630 AD, during the reign of Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan.
