

PIMA Convention's History

Regular gatherings are part of organizational culture; for ideological organizations they carry even more importance. PIMA was founded in 1979 at Lahore and its first convention was attended by 49 doctors; its name suggested was 'Pakistan Doctors Forum'. Its vision and objectives were laid down. Dr Magbool Shahid, consultant oncologist of Lahore was elected as its first President, who nominated Dr Shaikh Magbool. consultant psychiatrist, also of Lahore, as General Secretary. Prof Khursheed, chairman planning commission was invited as key note speaker.

Its constitution was formed in 1981. Initially yearly conventions were held, till 1988. In Multan when it was suggested to hold it every two years. The alternate year was suggested for holding provincial conventions, again biennially.

The conventions of PIMA are organizational as well as educational. In each, members elect President and a working body (shoora) for the next



'khairun nas mayyanfaun nas' are some examples.

The educational component comprises largely of religious, socio-cultural, ethical and current issues facing doctors and Muslim Ummah. Renowned scholars from Pakistan and the world have deliberated thought provoking lectures that are difficult to compare. In the last ten years or so, inclusion of scientific topics has given it a different dimension with





term of two years. All its elections are by secret ballot, without any canvassing or self proposal i.e. no one presents himself for any post rather members themselves chose their representatives. The composition of shoora is proportionate to the number of members in the province and district.

The theme of the conventions is traditionally a Quranic verse or a hadith; 'ihdinassiratal mustageem',

updates in medical sciences and training workshops and symposia which attract mostly doctors in training and medical students.

PIMA conventions are very keenly attended by PIMA members and other doctors, medical students; the attendance in the last few years has clearly been more than any other medical event in the country, usually in thousands. For PIMA members they also serve a 'reunion' which is difficult



otherwise in today's busy world. They stay together, attend sessions and then have plenty of time to mix. Female Branch of PIMA also makes special arrangements for travelling and stay in line with our noble religious norms.

Prior to 2014, twenty two conventions

Competence in medicine is crucial to perform the job to the required standards. The welfare of patients remains the primary interest and first and foremost duty of doctors. Doctors associated with Pakistan Islamic Medical Association (PIMA) expressed these views at a career guidance seminar held at Aga Khan University Auditorium. In a statement issued later on, they said, "Every year thousands of medical graduates pass out without a clear vision and many of them end up

The sufferings and the loss of life owing to it could be significantly reduced by early detection. There is lack of awareness about miseries of its advancement & opportunities of early detection.

Women Self Care Program by PIMA Female Branch addresses this by providing awareness of risk factors & course of breast cancer, educating the women about early self detection methods and informing the women about screening protocols & referral mechanisms. During previous session WSCP arranged 54 Public Awareness lectures in Karachi, Hyderabad, Hala, Sukhar, Gujranwala, Islamabad, Faisalabad, Jhang where 5600 women attended and 20 doctors participated. Individual Counseling provided to about 200,200 women. 8000 Informatory handouts & brochures were also distributed.

Lecture for enhancing the Religious Knowledge of doctors at Karachi

"Law of Pakistan regarding inheritance abides Shari'ah except when people decide to follow their own tribal values, even if they go against Shari'ah," said Faiza Khalil, President Pakistan Islamic Lawyers Forum in a lecture organized by PIMA Female Branch for enhancing the religious knowledge of doctors. She also mentioned that such acts result in biased, unjust and unislamic decisions.

Childhood Cancer is curable

The cell is basic structural and functional unit of our bodies. Normal cells of the different organs generally reproduce in an organized fashion for proper functioning of the body. After certain duration, they are destroyed and replaced by newer cells. Sometimes the mechanism controlling this normal cell turn over stops working efficiently because of damage to the genetic material. This leads to rapid and uncontrolled division of cells. These abnormal cells don't die as normal cells do and keep on reproducing erratically, eventually resulting in formation of a tumor. This tumor may remain confined within the organ's structural limits. However at time, the cells break off from the tumor and start invading adjacent organs or travel to the distant organs of the body. This abnormal and uncontrolled growth of cells and their ability to invade other body parts are characteristic features of a cancerous or malignant tumor. Type of the cancer is determined by the cells and the organ from where it was originated. In contrast to cancers, non-cancerous or benign tumors can also grow large, but they neither invade surrounding structures nor have potential for spread to the distant parts of the body.

Childhood cancers generally differ from adult cancers regarding their potential for curability. According to most recent world-wide estimates, more than 250,000 children are annually diagnosed with cancer and about 90,000 of those die from their disease. This number is staggering realizing the fact that 70% of all childhood cancers are curable. In developed world, some childhood cancers have achieved upto 95% cure rates due to modern diagnostic and therapeutic facilities. An estimated 80% of childhood cancer patients are living in developing countries. Unluckily the outcome of most of these cancers is very poor in resource limited settings. Delayed presentation or referral is a major factor which converts a large number of potentially curable cancers into incurable disease. Other major obstacles in cancer treatment in developing countries include lack of public awareness about cancer, low index of suspicion for cancer by treating physicians, non-availability of medicines, high cost of treatment, lack of trained professionals, very few dedicated cancer centres/wards and unsatisfactory supportive care facilities.

Despite the availability of state of the art multi-disciplinary treatment facilities at Shaukat Khanum Memorial Cancer Hospital and Research Centre (SKMCH) Lahore, we encounter a lot of challenges in treating childhood cancers presenting in advanced stages. On the other hand, cancers detected and referred earlier have better chances of complete cure. It is proven fact that lives of several kids with cancer can be saved through public awareness campaigns. The world's

leading stakeholder for childhood cancers, International Society of Pediatric Oncology (SIOP), advocates that if a child has following symptoms, he must be referred for further evaluation:

 Pale appearing child, with bruising or bleeding and/or general bone pains.



- Appearance of a lump or swelling in any part of the body, which persists without pain, fever or other signs of infection.
- Unexplained weight loss, fever and/or sweating at night.
- Apparent changes in eye, for example white pupil, new onset squint, loss of vision, bruising or swelling around one or both eyes.
- 5. Abdominal mass or distension.
- Persistent severe headache, especially during early morning hours and associated with vomiting.
- 7. Appearance of a painless lump.

Electronic and print media can play instrumental role in conveying this useful awareness message to the masses. At the same time, it is extremely pertinent to better educate ...continued on Page 09

They should be familiar with approach to diagnose cancers with the relevant laboratory tests and immediate care to stabilize the patient before referral to the cancer centre. Improvement in infra-structure, expansion of already existing services and establishment of new cancer centres by the state would be of paramount importance. As health care professionals, let us pledge to make efforts for elimination of factors responsible for the delay in diagnosing childhood cancers and hence prove the fact that most childhood cancers are curable.

2254 Free Eye Surgeries performed in Nigeria



POB performed 13,450 eye surgeries during 2012-14

Prevention of Blindness (POB) Trust, a project of PIMA performed 13,450 eye surgeries during the session 2012-14. POB's volunteer doctors attended 85 free eye camps held in the country and abroad. Total 103,167 eye patients were examined free of cost. POB Trust was established in July, 2007 as a leading volunteer eye care organization with the sole mission of preventing blindness and preserving sight. Since its foundation POB has organized 494 free eye camps in which 1,000,502 patients have been examined and 100,621 surgeries performed. POB has also been working on different international projects like Gaza Palestine Training Workshops in 2013, Somaliland Diploma Program and School Eye Care Program.

Free Medical Camps

PIMA organizes free medical and specialist camps for the needy people in remote areas throughout the country on regular basis. Total 177 camps were arranged all over the country during the session 2012-14. The detail report is given below.


